**Vocabulary Parade and Readathon**

On **Monday 4<sup>th</sup> March** Miss Macdonald will be holding an assembly to launch our annual Readathon with Read for Good. Children will be raising funds to provide books for local major hospitals as well as our own school library. All children will take home a Readathon sponsor form. Please fill this in and bring back to school before **22<sup>nd</sup> March**. Cash can be sent in with the form or a payment can be made online. Instructions are on the sponsorship form.

On Friday **8<sup>th</sup> March** we will be holding our **World Book Day**.

All children are invited to come to school dressed in whatever they please to represent any word they would like but adjectives (describing words) tend to work best. Parents and children can be as creative as they like.

Adjective examples:

Dress as a footballer – Adjective could be ‘Skilful’, ‘Healthy’, ‘Athletic’, ‘Energetic’, ‘Speedy’ or ‘Determined’.

Dress as a ballerina – Adjective could be ‘Strong’, ‘Elegant’, ‘Skilful’, ‘Flexible’ or ‘Focused’.

Dress as a monster – Adjective could be ‘Scary’, ‘Frightening’, ‘Hair-raising’, ‘Terrifying’ or ‘Petrifying’.

Dress as a scientist – Adjective Could be ‘Inquisitive’, ‘Curious’, ‘Intrigued’, ‘Intelligent’ or ‘Focused’.

We would like every child to have the word written in some form on their outfit.

This may be written on a sticky label. Written on card and pinned to the outfit or some other creative way of displaying the chosen word. All children will take part in a Vocabulary Parade in school on the day to show off their words and outfits.
